



CPR/First Aid Guide

CPR/First Aid is an important health & safety component of your program. To ensure accurate training and documentation, please use this guide as a resource.

1. Research the company/person teaching CPR/First Aid to ensure they are authorized by a nationally recognized health organization (i.e. National Safety Council, American Heart Association, American Red Cross, First Response Safety Training, etc.).
2. Pediatric First Aid and Infant/Child CPR with a Hands-On component is required. Inform any Instructor you hire that the certificate/card needs to state that you/your staff were taught Pediatric First Aid & Infant/Child CPR with a Hands-On component.
3. The instructor must provide certificates/cards with the participant's name, instructor's name, instructor's number, certification date, expiration date, name of modules taught, and the logo with nationally recognized health organization information.
